

WITH JUNE COMES SUMMER AND WITH SUMMER COMES VACATIONS

Six tips for safe travel this summer from the Board of Pensions of the First Presbyterian Church USA

As the country begins to reopen, travel is on the rise this summer. Yet many restrictions remain, and rules vary from location to location. If you'll be taking a trip, it's important to be informed and to travel responsibly. Here are some things to consider and tips to protect yourself and others during your trip.



Be informed. Before you leave home, check the websites of the Centers for Disease Control and **Prevention (CDC) and** the World Health Organization (WHO) for health advisories and self-quarantine re-

quirements. You should also be aware of any state and local restrictions that may apply and keep checking for updates as you travel. Consider checking the U.S. Transportation **Security Administra**tion's website and your airline's website for additional guidance.

Consider the risks associated with different types of travel. Air travel requires spending time in security lines and terminals, which can increase your risk for exposure to the virus that causes **COVID-19. Traveling** by car or recreational vehicle often involves stops that could put you and your traveling companions in close contact with other people and surfaces.

Check hotel websites to learn about precautions being taken. Consider bringing cleaning supplies with you to disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as light switches, faucets, door knobs,



and the television remote control. You should also confirm the hotel's cancellation policy before booking a room.

Practice good hygiene. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcoholbased hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol. Pack enough hand sanitizer with you and keep it within easy reach.

Avoid close contact with others. Keep six feet away from others and wear a mask or face covering in public spaces.

Do not travel if you are sick or vou have been around someone with Covid-19 in the last 14 days.






Mission Donations: The Gibson City Restoration Committee is in the process of purchasing the Loy Building after several months of fundraising and after reviewing an updated building report prepared by SHS Consulting Engineers from Decatur. Session approved \$3,000 for grant writer expenses to seek out funds to help restore the building. Mary Clow will be assisting the Committee in writing a Request for Proposal to find a grant writer. Session also approved a \$2,000 donation to assist with the general liability and building insurance needed once the Loy building is purchased. In addition, Session has approved the donation of \$500 to the Catsnap Pet Adoption Service out of Champaign. They assisted the restoration Committee in trapping 12 cats that will be cared for and adopted out to loving families.


