


CONGREGANT ACTIVITIES

Pat Farris had one of the winning Church tickets and the \$250 cash prize was donated back to the Shriners.







Many times we go to God To offer up a prayer. We seek to change the path we trod To cast on Him each care.


Oft times with this we struggle Not sure how we should start. We bow our head, when really It's time we bowed our heart.




